

Alexander Kitroeff is Professor of History at Haverford College in Pennsylvania, where he has been teaching courses on Modern European and Mediterranean history since 1996. His research interests focus on nationalism, ethnicity and identity in modern Greece and the Diaspora, across a broad spectrum, from politics to sports. His recent publications include *Greek Orthodoxy in America: A Modern History* (2020), *The Greeks and the Making of Modern Egypt* (2019). He has also collaborated with film director Maria Iliou as historical consultant in several documentary films -such as *Smyrna 1922: the Destruction of a Cosmopolitan City-* and more recently "Athens From East to West, 1821-1896" the first of a 5-part series on the city's modern history. He is currently working on an project on the history of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA) to mark the organization's centenary in 2022.
